As a Catholic school, we are extremely proud to dedicate the Month of October to the Holy Rosary. We take pride in our faith and belief in the Boarding House as we pray together as a family every night. A number of the Boarders lead the school in prayer on a Monday evening at 17:15 when we pray the Holy Rosary together. We invite the St Benedict's family to join us every week.

The Rosary is a Christian devotion which uses a sequence of prayer and meditation. Praying the rosary unites vocal and mental prayer in meditation on the central mysteries of the Christian faith – significant events from the life of Christ such as the Nativity, the Crucifixion and the Resurrection. The beads are used to "count" prayers.

The conscious mind is engaged in constantly repeating the words of set prayers, but this is more than just praying by rote, because at the same time you also enter an inner silence, wherein you contemplate Christ and his love for us in the mystery at hand.
