Academics

The Boarders accepted this challenge by increasing the study time needed to achieve this target and fulfill our motto, "There is no room for mediocrity". Mpho led by example as he achieved his full colours for academics through the year and finished four distinctions in his final exams. Well done Mpho!

Your goal for 2022 nearly came true as every grade within the Boarding House achieved an average of over 60%:

Grade 8 (2022)- 61% Grade 9 (2022)- 60% Grade 10 (2022)- 64% Grade 11 (2022)- 68%

There is clearly a lot of work to be done within the house but the groundwork has been set and results will come.

The Lent Period

The season of Lent teaches us many valuable lessons about life. It reminds us that life is not limited only to what can be conceived by the senses. The things that we see, hear, smell, touch, and taste, are real components of life, and they add value in the quality of life as it is lived on a daily basis.

However, one of the important lessons we learn from the season of Lent is that peace and happiness can only be achieved through a harmonious interaction among all created being, especially human beings.

In the Gospel Reading of Ash Wednesday (Matthew 6:1-6,16-18) Jesus extends a special invitation for us to give alms, to pray, and to fast. When we give alms, we participate in the divine mission of working with God to answer the prayers of His children who are in need. When we pray, we enter into an exclusive and sacred space where we are with no one else but God. Here we are able to talk to God and tell Him all of what is in our minds and hearts.
